Chairman's Report :

As we are all aware this is the inaugural year for the Notts County Golf Society and i think it has been a tremendous success. We have gone from strength to strength since we all first met that Thursday night in September 2010 when 7 of us turned up at the Home Bar in Arnold.

The membership got up to around 30, having said that not all of that number actually paid, so as time has gone on, some have lost interest ,and others have joined us. We now have a fully paid up membership of 29 members, 6 of that number joining at the Leen Valley match, so it is quite pleasing that we have sustained that number in our first year.

I do think that we have played some great courses in the past 12 months and we have also had some good deals laid on for us, this being on the back of the name Notts County F.C., in a few cases.

All games have been most enjoyable and as we have got to know each other it has become a great social day out, most of all we have conducted ourselves in a good way wherever we have played, although i thought at the first couple of games that there was a case for most to attend a "course etiquette training school", however as games have been played the etiquette has improved.

We do try and alternate matches between a Sunday & Wednesday as some can make these day's on an alternative basis, what with mid-week work commitments etc it gives them a week-end choice, this seems to be working ok as we are getting round about the same numbers on both days. Think we have taken in a wide range of courses throughout the past year and on balance they have all been good.

As you are aware we have had the handicap master software for a good while now and whilst it has had it's teething problems, due in the main to myself not having instant knowledge of the system on match days, but i am finding the system pretty good especially when time is of essence after a match, The licence for this will need renewing in 2012, so i hope this meets meets with all your approvals.

As i mentioned early on in the year i am trying to get some sort of a competition going with Notts County, Leicester City and Derby County, something that we could play competitively against on a 3 way league or something, hopefully this will develop in 2012.

I am in the process of having our very own golf shirt produced and hopefully i will have it to show you all today, if you approve i hope that we will all be wearing them on our society days, they will be available to all members at just above cost price and then the rest will go into the club shop and sold there, with any profit going between ourselves and Notts County F.C., initially we will have to borrow the money to get these shirts produced and i am hoping Ray will help us on this until such time as we can get them sold in the shop.

Finally, i will suggest a couple of topics that may or may not be factored in for the coming year :

Do we pay an annual subscription ?

Do we look, seriously, at having some kind of away day or 2 ?, or even getting a couple of days away in Turin and taking in a Juventus game, which, for those that could not make it is a truly great experience.

Out of the funds we have a cup/shield made, something of quality, maybe call it the Jimmy Sirrel Memorial Trophy, or, more apt at this moment, the Notts County 1862 trophy, or any other suggestions, This can run from 1st January 2012 until 31st December 2012 on meetings of say 10 or more in attendance which would make the meeting a qualifier, or make all meetings a qualifier ??

At the end of each year the member with the best score throughout the year has their name on the trophy, this can either be done on net scores or gross scores, let's decide.



I pass on the thanks of the J&J fund raising committee to the Notts County Golf Society for us giving a prize of a vintage bottle of whisky to the fund raising night with Colin Slater, Les Bradd, Brian Stubbs and Don Masson, I attended this fund raiser on the Golf Society's behalf and it was very much appreciated, just a note on this, out of all the prizes that the winner had to chose it was the Whisky that went straight away.

Venues and dates to be decided and booked as soon as possible and put on web site in a calendar format so that members could plan the year ahead. The dates published may be subject to alteration due to various events that are being held by Notts County F.C. during the 150 year celebrations.

It was proposed by **Luke Alexander** seconded by **Andy Bryan** that between the months of November – February that we carry on playing matches at Ramsdale Park Golf Course on the Lee course, which is one of the finest par 3 courses in the county.

It was proposed by **Alan Molloy** seconded by **Mick Smith** that all members to pay £20.00 subs for the coming year.

It was proposed by **David Jeffrey** seconded by **Nigel Hammond** that where possible on match days that we play as a 3 ball, this is so as not to antagonise members of the club where we are playing as we may be in a large group. As explained this would be done as much as we are allowed to do it.

The Chairman suggested that for future years we play for a Trophy on a point's basis between March – October, the overall winner on the day will receive 15 points, runner up 14 points, reducing by one point per position down to player 15. These games will all be classed as qualifiers.

The Chairman suggested that the society purchase a good quality trophy to be presented to the winner at the end of the season, the trophy to go in the cabinet in the Stadium and a keepsake be presented for the winner to keep. **Ray Trew** said that if he was excused for a few moments he may have something of interest, **Ray** came back with a very nice "Claret Jug" type of trophy which has the name NOTTS COUNTY F.C. ANNUAL CELEBRITY GOLF TOURNAMENT, **Ray** said that he had come across it in some dark cupboard was in danger of being accidently thrown away. **Ray** was thanked for this, we all decided that the trophy be cleaned by a professional and this would be what we play for every year.

It was also suggested that we have a singles competition between all members that wished to play. This was well received so i will go ahead and get some kind of format / play by dates and a draw set up.

Proposals/ Suggestions for 2013 season :

Subscriptions

I suggest that the £20 is still payable by all members per season.

Passed. There would also be the opportunity for guests to join us on our society day, A £5.00 fee above members price would be added to the guest. Guests would not be elegable to any championship points or entry into the singles.

Singles Competition

The Singles competition to have all names that wish to take part "in the hat" by no later than the last day of Febuary 2013, no exceptions, the singles to be free to all members.

Passed.

1862 Championship

The 1862 Championship to be run on a points table, the points being those that are accumilated on the Stableford Society Days, 40 points 39 points etc, not 10 points 8 points etc as was done in the 2012 season. I would also like to intoduce a best of 5 from 8 for this Championship which i believe would keep most conteders interested right down to the last game, so you may miss 3 matches and still be in with a shout as only the best 5 scores would count. 8 Matches to be played from March 2013 through to October 2013, one game being the Captains choice, which would be at a course of his choice.

Passed, with the 10 points, 8 points, 6 points etc, still remain.

Society Days

I would suggest that on Society days we book a meal, regardless, as it seems to be a more sociable thing to do after a game.

I also suggest that there will be no prize for the winner or runner up, just the points. Also no nearest the pin in 1 or 2 shots as we did this year. This will reduce the fees that the society have charged.

I will have a seperate sheet for any that would like to enter a "2's" competition, It would be £5.00 per person, all given to the winner (s) and not compulsory, no winner (s) money given back. This makes the day cheaper for those that do not want to enter the "2's", of course for those that wish to gamble more between themselves that is their choice.

Passed, but no meals to be booked, just barebones green fees, with £1.00 added to buy a sleeve of golf balls for the winner and runner up.

All members will be included in each fixture, <u>THE ONUS WILL BE ON THE INDIVIDUAL</u> <u>MEMBERS TO NOTIFY, VIA TELEPHONE, OR EMAIL, THROUGH THE WEBSITE, THAT</u> <u>THEY WILL NOT BE AVAILABLE,</u> This makes it easier to administer for the officers of the society that have to get it together on the day. <u>IF THE PLAYER DOES NOT NOTIFY THAT</u> <u>THEY WON'T BE PLAYING A WEEK PRIOR THEY WILL BE LIABLE FOR ANY COSTS THAT</u> <u>THE SOCIETY MAY INCURR.</u>

1862 Championship :

A suggestion was made by the chair that the points system be based solely on the amount of stable ford points that each individual accumulated during the best 5 from 8 games this coming season and

that the table with 10 points for 1st,8 points for 2nd etc be scrapped. After much discussion this was voted on in favour as a trial for season 2014 and if it was found to be a fairer way, be adopted permanently.

PRESENTATION :

Manager Shaun Derry joined the meeting and presented Paul Cottee with the 1862 Championship Cup and John Smalley with the singles trophy. Shaun was thanked for taking the time out to do this and it was much appreciated.

SHIRTS, PULLOVERS :

It was decided that the society should explore the possibility of purchasing shirts, jumpers with the society's logo on them. Nick Everitt said he would contact someone he knew regarding this, and get some pricing details. Paul Cottee also said he would ask for some embroidery prices. All agreed that this was the way forward.

SINGLES COMPETITION :

It was decided that the singles competition would be played for again this coming season.

HANDICAP MASTER SYSTEM :

It was discussed that the handicapping system, a computer based system, was much to harsh and should be adjusted to represent a fairer way as to getting shots back, this was voted non by the majority and accepted. The chair to do this adjustment on the system with the help of Alan Molloy if necessary.

It was also decided that the winner of each competition should not have an automatic one shot deduction.

2014 SEASON :

It was decided that the chair, treasurer, secretary and captain get together in the very near future to arrange the dates and venues for the forthcoming season, this was agreed. Once again there is a reminder that signing in and paying fees is **AT LEAST 30 MINUTES BEFORE 1st TEE OFF.**

CAPTAINS DAY :

Once a gain the captain will choose a venue of his choice, the captain is responsible for the various competitions that he / she chooses, this is over and above normal competitions that are run throughout the season.

TWO'S COMPETITION :

A two's competition will be available on society days, £2.00 per person, winner(s) takes all. In case of a rollover only members allegeable for this, will be those that were in the last two's.

BANK ACCOUNT :

Once again it is reminded that any subscriptions, payments etc can be done online by direct transfer into the Society's bank account, this is proving a popular way in which to pay in.

Malcolm asked if everyone had read the minutes from the last AGM on line and if they had not a hard copy was handed around.

The minutes were passed as a true representation and passed

Chair report:

Well it has been just over 4 years since the inaugural meeting at the Home Bar in Arnold; it was a wet night on Thursday 23rd September 2010 when the Notts County Golf Society was born, with the full backing of Ray Trew, owner of NCFC.

There were 8 people at that first meeting and out of that 8 there are still 4 members at this present time, things have changed since 2010, thankfully we have a lot more members now, although we do not have a waiting list we have survived and enjoyed it, we have always welcomed new members and hopefully will continue to do so, whether they are NCFC supporters or not, it is in this vein that I welcome the 2 new members that are joining us today, so I welcome **TERRY LEE & JOHN HICKMAN**.

As I have said it is 4 years since the society was formed and I have been privileged to be the Chair since then, it has been a great journey & I have enjoyed the ride, alas I now feel that it is time to step down and let someone else take over the reigns and move the society forward, I will therefore not be seeking re-election, what I will do is offer my services to run the website, which also includes the Handicap Master system which is embedded into our site. I do think that the role of running the society in the future should be placed on the elected secretary not the Chair as in the past.

I have received a few suggestions about the present handicapping system ? Procedure, so I would like to take this opportunity to clarify a few points on this subject.

The system cannot accommodate that a +2 or a -2 for scores above / below 30 points scored in competition, this is not the fault of the system.

The system is set up as per the ruling of the 2013 AGM, I spent many hours with Alan Molloy going through it and the parameters are set to what was agreed, exactly as requested, which are as follows:

Whilst Malcolm was discussing the changes to the handicap system NG produced a spread sheet that he had put together too look at the score against par for the last two years and worked out the handicap for each member based on the score.

NG explained how the calculations were worked out.

Each time a player entered a score for a competition, only scores up to a double bogey are taken into account and score over this was adjusted to a double bogey, then when all 18 of the adjusted scores are added together and the par for the course deducted this was the variance that was averaged out over the past two years. The revised handicaps are listed below.

If a player played less than 3 completions' in this time then they are highlighted in Orange.

NE suggested that the situation was becoming too complicated, and there was a discussion by all members present about the above.

The assembled members where asked to think about theses changes before the Season starts again in March 2015.

RP brought up the question as to why there had been general play adjustments had been made to the handicaps as posted on the web site. Malc said that he hadn't made any adjustments and that he would investigate.

Treasurers Report:

Malc told those present that the balance of the bank account at that moment in time

was \pounds 1000.09 and with the expenditure for the meal today and purchase of this years trophies and engraving cost the available balance was \pounds 715.09

Election of officers :

Chairman:- MV proposed DS, seconded by PC passed

Secretary:- MV proposed NG, seconded by AB passed

Treasurer:- NG proposed AB , NE seconded passed

Web master / Handicap System :- As MV already has the software and for website and Handicap master System then it was passed that MV will continue to fill this role

Captain:- There were 2 members proposed for thr role of captain for 2015, MV and IR. A vote was taken by those present and the result was 7-4 in favour of MV. MV is to be the societies captain for 2015 with IR taking the role of vice captain for 2015 and he will automatically be elected as Captain for the 2016 season. at the AGM for 2015 then we will need to elect a vice captain to support IR in 2016.

DS took the chair and thabked MV for all his work and effort he had put into the running and setting up of the Society for the last 4 years. evyone agreed and gave MV a long round of applause.

The next item discussed was the points scoring system to determine the champion for 2015

it was decided that we revert back to the points as to where players finished in the qualifing games. instead of stableford points scored.

10 pts to be awarded to the winner

8pts to the runner up

6 pts to 3rd position

- 5 pts for 4th
- 4 pts for 5th
- 3 pts for 6th

2 pts for 7th

1 pt for 8th.

At this point Greg Abbott entered the room to do the presentations of trophies to the champion golfer of 2015 and Singles Champion 2015

Champion for 2015 was Malcolm Voce.

Singles Champion for 2015 was Derek Prudham.

DS thanked Greg for attending and everyone gave Greg a round of applause. Greg also stated that he would try and attend a cople of the socieities games in 2015 and would try to encourage others from Notts County FC to attend as well.

Greg left the room and the meeting continued.

The meeting moved on to discuss where to play the societies matches in 2015. it was decided that the captain and secretary to meet up early in January 2015 to finalise venues and dates

it was decided that the majority of the societies games take place on Sundays as these had a better attendance with a mid week dates at the first and final matches so that we could benfit from earlier tee times and take advantage of courses that dont permit societies during the weekend. the secretary and captain will look into the courses like Coxmoor to see what the cost would be to play there mid week and if in their opinion that the cost would have an adverse effect on attendance. Bulwell Forest Golf course was suggested as the Pro there was a Notts County supporter and that he had offered a favorable deal.

Once the dates had been agreed then the secretary would send these out to all members early in 2015 so that people could add them to their diaries.

RP suggested that the comittee should meet on a regular basis . this was seemed to be a good idea and would be adopted this year.

RP also suggested that the golf society have a weekend away as they did in 2014 which seemed to be an enjoyable experience for those who attended. MV suggested that it should take place in June. NG to investigate courses cost and availibility for a saturday night stay and pass information on to all. RP also suggested that abroad may be an option, he has contacts and will pass these on.

Next was a discussion about playing a match against the ex Notts County Players Association . NG will pursue this.

Next was a discussion as to if members have to be Notts County Supporters to be a

member. many felt that this could be quite restrictive and that as this was a mainly a golf society that the members should have a passing interest .

The discussion then reverted back to handicapping system and handicap analysis

just say a big thank you to Nick, Andy & Malcolm who organise everything from the fixtures to money and website.

In particular to Nick who took over the role of secretary from Malcolm at the AGM last year and he has really worked hard on our behalf.

There is talk about adding a couple more games to the diary during the summer months, this will enable more mid-week games which is welcoming and I am sure will be received gladly at the meeting.

Lastly I would like to welcome my successor, Ian Roberts, Ian will bring another dimension to the captaincy, as we know Ian is "on the board" of Notts County Football Club, this is evident by the boundless questions that he gets thrown at him with regards to the football team & matters on the pitch, Ian takes it in his stride and duly provides information when he can.

Treasures Report:

At this present time there is a total of £1183.90 in the account from this there is a deposit of \pm 50.00 for Newark (1st game of Season) and \pm 60.00 to cover the cost of the trophies and engraving.

This gives a balance of £1073.90 but the cost of today's event will need to be deducted.

Due to Work Commitments Andy is going to have to step down from the role of Treasurer.

The chair praised Andy for all his efforts over the years.

The cost of membership is to remain at £20.00 for the year; this enables the club to pay deposits for the upcoming seasons match's

Those who had paid ± 25 for todays event who where season ticket holders overpaid by a total of ± 10 this can be taken from the membership or from the first game that they attend this season.

Election of Officials:

Chair RP nominated DS, this was seconded by TC There were no further nominations David Sadler was re-elected unanimously

Secretary

NE nominated NG continue, this was seconded by PR

There were no further nominations

Nick Galpin was re-elected unanimously

Treasurer

DS nominated Malcolm, this was seconded by NG

There were no further nominations

Malcolm Voce was elected

Vice-Captain IR nominated that he should be superseded by Andy Bryan. This was passed

Web / Handicap Master

Malcolm to Continue as Web/Handicap Master this was agreed by all present.

Increase in Number of Qualifiers:

There was a proposal to add an additional 4 midweek matches into the forthcoming season

After deliberation it was decided that it would be better if this was amended to 2 one in May and one in September. NG to rearrange the provisional dates and arrange courses. It was asked if this made for any further workload onto the Secretary. He replied that it didn't.

AB asked will these additional games have a detrimental effect onto the singles matches. It was decided that those who could see this being a problem always have the option not to enter the singles competition for that year as it was last year.

It was also agreed that the 1862 Championship increase to the best 6 from 10 from the best 5 from 8

Changes to 1862 Championship Scoring:

There was a discussion at the last game of the season what would the effect to the championship if it was based on scored Stableford points. There was a discussion to the pro's and cons of each system and a vote was taken

The vote was 8 to 4 to retain the points system based on where the player finished in the game.

Overnight Stay:

The Overnight stay was provisionally dated for the week end of the 25th June.

It was suggested that it should be this 1st week end of June, It was also suggested that we go to a different place so this ruled out Morley Hayes, The forest of Arden was also rejected.

The secretary to enquire about availability of the other courses on the new date and provisionally book it for that date.

This year there would be an increase of 4 to 16 players

Suggested Courses:

It was suggested that courses that are within a 40 mile radius of Meadow Lane.

This would add a greater choice of courses to play

The cost for each Course should not exceed £30.00

The Captain suggested that he would like his day to be at the Nottinghamshire with a meal at the end. NG to investigate

It was also suggested that if we were to play any of the premium courses that the club may be able to subsidise the cost. This will be looked into on a course by course basis.

Presentation of Trophies:

During the Meeting Ricardo Moniz entered the room and presented the 1862 Trophy to this year's winner Mark Beal and the Singles Champion to Matt Simpson.

After the presentation Ricardo spent a good 30 minutes answering any questions that those present. This was a great insight to his ethos and plans for the club.

After 30 mins he had to leave the room for other duties. All those present thanked him for his time

AOB:

New Society Shirts

It was suggested that as we have new members that we look into getting a new shirt for the coming Season, it was also suggested that we get a plain coloured one as these are in a greater supply than Stripped ones. PC will look into sourcing the shirts and also a better quality Jumper.

Game against the Ex players

RP suggested that it would be a good idea to play the ex players. All agreed and NG will try to arrange with them.

Can Singles Matches be played on society Days

PC as that if both players were in agreement could singles matches is played on society days.

There was a long discussion on this point and in the end the proposal was put to the vote

The vote was 5 yes and 8 No

Therefore NO singles matches to be played on society days.

Handicapping Issues

NE explained his proposal of deduction of points for first second and third positions and additional shots added for the bottom three as opposed to the current computer based system that we currently use. It was felt that the current system penalised winners but gave very little opportunity for players to gain shots.

NG said that the current system could be 'tweaked' and that he would look into this and does some analysis to what effect the tweaking would do and the NE proposal would have and pass his findings onto all members for information

As we were on the subject of handicaps RP mentioned that general adjustments were taking place early in each year. MV says he has not manually changed any. It was suggested that this may be a built in feature to the software that is being used and NG will investigate and keep an eye on the handicaps early next year.

- Apologies : Nick Galpin (secretary), Lee Houston, Richard Parsons, David Jeffrey.
- Chairman opened the meeting and thanked all in attendance.
- Minutes of the last meeting were read and were passed as a true record.
- Chairmans report: The Chairman thanked the secretary for a wonderful choice of courses that we had played this season. He also said that it would be nice to have a few more members to join us.
- **Treasurer's report:** The treasurer stated that the account bank balance as of 19th November 2016 stood at £1,067.66, this amount is up to date as of the morning of 19/11/2016, the only expenses to come out of the account for 2016 is the cost of the AGM which is being subsidised by £5.00 per member.
 - There are a number of subscriptions for 2017 included in the balance.Current bank statements & Receipts for 2016 where passed around the meeting.

There were no questions on this & the accounts were passed as a true record.

- Secretaries report: due to the Secretary being away no report was given but he passed on all relevant information about the overnighter for 2017, The meeting thanked the Secretary for his hard work for the society over the past year.
- Captains report: The captain reported that it was a wonderful day at the Nottinghamshire GC, which was the venue for the Captains Day in 2016, and thanks everyone for supporting on this day.
- The meeting then welcomed Andy Bryan, the societies's Captain for 2017, Andy was asked to nominate his Vice Captain for 2017 and he named Mark Beal, this was accepted by the meeting,
- Election of officers of the society for 2017 : There were no proposals on this matter so the meeting decided to elect last years officers en block, all the officers accepted the positions.

- **Proposal 1**: A proposal was put forward by Derek Prudham that the prizes be restructured so that more people has a a chance of winning at the matches, after a discussion the following was decided by the meeting : Still retain a prize for 1st place, 2nd place & nearest the pin, these would be cash prizes that would be paid out of the voluntary £5 per person that was paid in on each match, split between the 3 with 1st prize taking the most.
- Additionally there would be 2 more prizes, best front 9 holes & best back 9 holes, these 2 prizes could not be won by the player winning the 1st prize or the 2nd prize, however the player winning nearest the pin would be eligible. The prizes for best front 9 & best back 9 would be a sleeve of balls each, to be purchased in bulk by the treasurer form the Club shop with NCFC logo if possible.All were in agreement on this.
- Proposal 2 : Derek Prudham proposed that for any player with a handicap of 28, who scores less than 20 points in 4 successive competitions their handicap is increased by 8 to 36.
- An amendment was received by Malcolm Voce : that the handicap ceiling in our handicap system be raised to 36, this is in accordance with CONGU & EGU rules introduced in January 2016 that men are permitted to receive 36 strokes, not compulsory but a club choice. A furthermore proposal that Nigel Hammond be given an immediate handicap change to 36 strokes, and if anyone else is struggling on 28 strokes the system would adjust this automatically, this was agreed by the meeting.
- **Proposal 3 :** Malcolm Voce proposed that subscriptions be increased to £25 per person, the current £20 has been in force for 6 years and whilst we have no intention of our society being a savings club costs have increased and we do need to think about any kind of contingency that we MAY need, also that the deposits have now gone up to £100, this is what Golf Clubs are asking as a deposit for confirmation, as against £50 in the past. Also with the additional prizes that have just been passed the increase will take care of that. After discussion the meeting was in agreement that subs be £25.00 per person.
- **Proposal 4 :** Malcolm Voce stated that the Singles competition has been left to the 2 finalists to organise the final between themselves, i believe that the singles competition, (now named Mike Edwards Singles Shield), deserves a little more than to be left to its own devices, therefore i propose that the Society as a whole takes responsibility for the final, setting a date well in advance, choosing the venue & paying the green fees for it. Also the increase in subscriptions would go some way to doing this, The meeting was in agreement.
- •Overnighter: Secretary sent the following details with regards to our "Saturday Driver" in June :
- Greetham Valley, near Grantham, staying in lodges price is £125 per person.
- Staverton Park, near Daventry £139.00 per person , with a 20% discount on bar drinks.
- Helidon Lakes, near Daventy £109.00 per person.
- Windmill Village, near Coventry £119 per person.
- The Belfry, near Tamworth £289.00 per person.

After discussion it was decided that the Society would go the Staverton Park for the 2017 overnighter.

Any Other business :

 Gordon Burden suggested that we have an evening, during the summer months, for a competition on the PAR 3 course at Ramsdale Park GC, gordon said that it should be a one off game with everyone playing off scratch. Those present where informed and agreed that this would be a good idea.

Is the society embracing the new CONGU handicap rules ready for next season? Basically making the max handicap for all 54 <u>http://www.congu.co.uk/congu-changes-2018/</u>

This was discussed and it was felt that would not be beneficial to the majority of the society. We currently have a max handicap of 36 and only 3 members are playing over 28. This would not be adopted for 2018 but the situation will be monitored going forward.

Would any members be interested in any other social events as a society now the numbers have increased? Maybe Go-karting or a night at the dogs etc.?

Any member of the Society is free to organise any event they want. They can use all the societies' methods of communication to facilitate these events; it was felt that if these events would add to the workload of the committee.

I do not participate in the singles comp but feel that the fixed venue is a little unfair and should be a neutral venue agreed by the finalists. I was unable to vote at last year's AGM as I was away on holiday.

It was agreed that the venue should be neutral but the date will be fixed.

Can we have future AGM's early December so we can have it as a society Xmas doo afterwards.

The date of the AGM is dependent on release of the next season's fixture list and so is not known until June of the following year. Also if we push closer toward Christmas member availability reduces due to other commitments.

Proposal from Paul Cottee. (rejected)

My second proposal is that instead of the AGM being subsidised I propose that the Captain and vice Captain receive free membership for the 2 years they are in Post they can use this money to put towards prizes on their Captains day.

This will cost the society £50 per year. In effect it will cost £90, 2 @ £45.

Proposal from Paul Cottee (rejected)

I also propose that all officers of the committee receive free membership whilst in post, as a thank you for their time.

This will cost the society £75 In effect it will cost £125, 5 posts @ £25.

Proposal from **Paul Cottee (passed)**

I also propose that prizes on the day are set the same for every game. Everyone still pays £5 each.

1st prize. £40

2nd prize £20

Nearest pin £20

If there is a short fall in prize money the society makes up the difference.

If there is surplus prize money the society keeps it for future games that may not get enough prize money.

This season there would have been a surplus of £15 by the last game

All the above would cost the society less than £300 which is what it costs the society to subsidise the AGM last year.

Proposal from Paul Cottee (passed)

I also propose that on the last match of the season instead of the order of play being drawn out of the hat.

Players go out in reverse order how they stand in the championship so the leader(s) goes out last.

1862 Championship (rejected)

As we all know the 2018 Championship finished with 2 players on level points based on the conversion system that we use.

At the moment we do not have a rule in place that will decide the winner outright, In order to help stop this happening again I make the following suggestion(s)

If a tie is made by 2,3 or maybe even 4 players we revert to the count back on our handicap master system, counting the last qualifying game of all players, it will be the best back 9, best 6, best 3, then the last hole.

If it is still a tie the qualifying round for each player will be taken into account as above, this is repeated until a winner is decided.

In the unlikely event that 1 player(s) on a tie has only played 5 or even 4 qualifying games against other player(s) that have played 6, the count back, as above, goes on until the player(s) has no more games to count, it will then be deemed as a draw.

In the event of a tie the winner will be decided by the total number of Stableford points accrued through our handicap master system using the count back if required.(passed)

1, For the par 3 comp, would it be more fairer to allow handicaps, granted not a full handicap but maybe 3/4 or half handicap for all, as the scratch event only tends to favour the low handicapped golfers for obvious reasons. Maybe even run 2 events at the same time with 2 trophies up for grabs one for scratch and one handicapped for the same game or have a separate game for this on a different day. (rejected)

2, Theres talk about a few arranging a golf week end abroad next year, maybe early or late in the year, could this be achieved as a society or just a few to go it alone, I for one would be interested either way. (for future discussion)

3,Re the rule about lost and out of bounds balls and a 2 shot penalty, are we as a society taking this on. Yes I am aware Malc that you were having a meeting about this but this is just for the AGM purpose (passed)

4, Any member playing at their own course. (see below)

Can we clarify that if any member of NCGS is a member of a picked course for the qualifiers that year that they either have to pay the society or not for the round. Should Nick Everitt pay to play at Coxmoor ? Should David Sadler pay to play Holinwell, should Malcolm pay to play Ramsdale, should terry pay to play Mapperley etc! after all their green fees have already been paid for at the said courses via memberships.

Any NCGS member that plays a society day at "their own course", is still required to pay the same amount as all other members, if the Golf Club does not charge for this member(s), the proceeds goes into the society funds. (passed)
